

PUSHKAR *Camel Fair*- NOVEMBER 02 - 11, 2011

...is one of the most colorful events in the Rajasthani festival calendar. From all over Rajasthan the Rebari tribe, who are traditionally camel herders, walk for weeks across the desert to Pushkar where they gather in great numbers to trade their animals. Pushkar, though primarily a camel fair, also has horses and cattle for sale. Here you will see the colors of Rajasthan sartorially vibrant people, dance, music, and for a photographer, it is a bonanza of candid pictures.

Suggested Itinerary

Day 1 – Fly to Delhi

Day 2: Delhi – Arrive and transfer to hotel

Day 3: Delhi / Agra– Drive to Agra. Tour of Agra city, including Agra Fort and Taj Mahal at sunset

Day 4: Agra/ Jaipur - Drive to Jaipur visiting Fatehpur Sikri en route

Day 5: Jaipur – City tour

Day 6: Jaipur – City Tour

Day 7: Jaipur/ Pushkar: Drive to Pushkar. Visit the Camel Fair festivities in the evening

Day 8: Pushkar: Camel Fair

Day 9: Pushkar/Delhi: Drive to Jaipur domestic airport and board flight to Delhi. In Delhi, transfer to international airport



P&L Luxury Tents:

Each air conditioned tent has wooden floors, and bathrooms with individual hot water geysers, showers and flush toilets. Heaters and hot water bottles are available at night, and a library tent is stocked with a small but interesting collection of books and magazines. All meals are served in an air conditioned dining tent, and each evening there is a performance of Raiasthani dance.
